**Subject:** Fee to Trust

Dear Constituent,

Knowing you represent groups which are very interested in the Fee to Trust issue for Camp 4, I wanted to let you know about a new development.

Supervisor Carbajal has informed me and the other Supervisors of a letter he received from Chairman Armenta requesting that the County begin government to government discussions on the Fee to Trust issue. Supervisor Carbajal has responded to him saying that he has alerted his colleagues on the Board to the Tribe's request and is evaluating how best to proceed. Once he has determined that course of action, Supervisor Carbajal said he will contact the Tribe.

My stance towards Fee to Trust has not changed. I remain opposed to any additional Fee to Trust applications and have stated repeatedly that if the Tribe does indeed want to build housing for their members, they should make an application through the County's Planning and Development Department. This will assure that any property taxes associated with the development would stay on the County tax rolls and proper environmental review and mitigation measures could be evaluated for the project.

While this land is in the Third District, I urge you to contact each of the other Supervisors to inform them of your position and concerns regarding the Chumash Tribe taking the 1,400 acre Camp 4 property into Trust.

That is all the information I have at this time and will keep you informed of any new developments. Please feel free to forward this information to any other groups or individuals that you know would be interested in this issue.
